-to wait for the bus. Behind him may be seen the park in which political demonstrations and counter demonstrations by groups along the lines of Occupy and the TEA Party are taking place. The Job Hunter frowns and grimaces as he listens to the various diatribes boosted by loudspeakers and megaphones until finally he can't bear it anymore and walks to-

-where he takes a Guy Fawkes mask from a box of them that is sitting there and puts it on before entering-

## EXT. THE PARK - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter begins to push through the crowd toward the stage where a speaker is ranting into a microphone at counter demonstrators some of whom have megaphones. (actors free to ad lib) When he gets to the side of the stage, he drops his belongings, gets up onto the stage, and before anyone can stop him, grabs the microphone from the speaker and-

JOB HUNTER (bellows into the microphone)
Will you people shut the fuck
uuuuuuupp!!!

Feedback erupts from all the loudspeakers and everyone in the park covers their ears in pain.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) Hello. I'd tell you who I am but I'd be very surprised if you cared. Now put your goddamn phones down!!! You paid for the fucking ticket, you can damn well watch the fucking movie!! I suppose this is the part where I tell you all how I got to this point. Ah, why not?

BEGIN FLASHBACK

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM - MORNING

The Job Hunter sits in his bed clothes in front of his computer eating cereal and looking like he just climbed out of bed. His hair has grown out and his beard is two months long. The computer has a tube monitor.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Good Morning. Welcome to my life.
This is how my day begins. No I'm
not playing World of Warcraft! I'm
doing what every responsible
jobless adult with no income does
every day, I'm job hunting! Hope
you're not bored easily.

He concentrates visibly on the screen.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)
Let's see! Job serious. First email
of the day. Customer service rep
for Jarkel. Eh, you take what you
can get.

The man clicks his mouse.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)
Hm. A holding company for insurance
and investments, eh? sounds good.
More importantly, can I get there
on the bus?

CONTINUED: 3.

Clicks his mouse again.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) Hey, I can. What do you know? Hokay, email resume, cover letter, and salary requirements.

He moves his mouse around and clicks intermittently.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) There goes another resume I'll never see again. Neeeext!

The man clicks his mouse again.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)
Hm. Half Robert has a customer
service rep position, too. Assuming
it's not the same position. Might
as well let them know I might be
interested.

He moves his mouse around and clicks intermittently.

The man's eyebrows raise.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) U-Haul needs a CSR, too? Wonder what that's like. Let's see where they are. Hm. Yeah I can get there on the bus. Let's see about... Aw an online application. I <a href="https://doi.org/10.1038/jac.2007/nate">https://doi.org/10.1038/jac.2007/nate</a> these. They take so long.

The man begins to type and move his mouse around, again clicking intermittently.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') Are we having fun, yet? And this is just the first three entries of the first email. I've still got twenty four more leads to look into on just this email. Then I've got six more emails to go through. This is my life. Don't you wish you were me? I bet you think I'll be employed inside of two weeks. Bullshit!! I've been doing this for two months now, and that was just since my last interview. It's been over a year since my last day of paid work and I can count the number of interviews I've had on (MORE)

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd)

one hand. I've got a Bachelor's degree in Computer Science from a fairly big name university and this is my life for going on twenty years now. I'm not even one of those people with a drug or alcohol problem. I don't have a prison record or a bankruptcy. There is no huge shameful event in my past which somehow marks me as unemployable, yet here I am. I'll have you know that I haven't even finished filling out the online application, yet. Depending on how much one must look up, an online application can take up to an hour to finish. Old employers, old addresses, old supervisors who probably are no longer there with phone numbers that probably no longer work. I'd put it all in a database or spreadsheet but I have enough trouble staying awake doing this.

The Job Hunter begins entering data.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') All right, I'll have mercy. Let's fast forward to lunch.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM - NOON

The Job Hunter is now showered and dressed and has traded in his breakfast dishes for a bowl of soup and a soda. A YouTube video is on the screen. The Job Hunter quietly eats during the next monologue.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Yeah, we're back here again. I
pretty much spend the day in front
of my computer. No place to go when
you're broke and unemployed and
there's no point in sitting at the
kitchen table when there's nobody
to sit with. A generation ago, I'd
probably have been sitting in front
of the TV. Despite appearances,
this is not a break. I am out of
things to do today other than sit
and wait by the phone and hope
(MORE)

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) someone calls. That's the place every day gets to eventually. Oh, sometimes I have work enough to last all day. Even into the night, but that's rare. It's unpaid data entry that I do every day. I might feel better about it if I got more phone calls. There have been days when I've spent all day sitting by the phone waiting for it to ring. I know what you're thinking: Get a cell phone, moron. Yeah, who's gonna pay for that? You? If I had a cell phone, I suppose I could go to the park or something. Might make it a little easier but my folks have enough of my bills to pay. What? You thought I could live in a place like this with no income. Nope, sorry to disappoint you, but this is my parents second condo. When the housing market went south, my parents sold some stock and bought this place. It was a lot more economical than paying my rent every month when I was out of work and they don't have a basement for me to live in anymore. That's right, I'm the guy who wound up living in his parents' basement after college. You can say they're helping me with rent. You can say I'm staying in their second condo. You can dress it up any way you like, it's still my parents' basement. Every piece of furniture or electronics is either a handmedown or a Christmas gift. A's in high school, B's in college, a computer science degree and I still can't get anyone to employ me. At least, not for any length of time. Every other month or so, I'll get a call from an agency for a one day job at someplace around town. If I can get there on a bus or scrape together cab fare, I'll go and install new software or new computers. JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) still won't hire a computer person. Those paychecks are precious money. With those, I can go to a restaurant or movie or something. I never saw 'The Lord of the Rings' movies in the theaters. I barely get to see anything. YouTube helps a lot. You can find all kinds of things to watch there. Classic movies, audio books, sports highlights, music, Broadway shows, classic major rock concerts, it's a poor man's cable television. It can almost make you forget your life is passing by and you're not getting that time back. I thought I told you to put down that cell phone!!! Yeah, all right, maybe I'm boring you.

The Job Hunter finishes eating, turns off his computer, and takes his dishes to the kitchen. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO KITCHEN - NOON

The man puts his dishes in the sink and turns to leave. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Come on. I'll show you some fun.
We'll do something I only do once a
week: we'll go...grocery shopping.
Wheeee.

#### EXT. THE CONDO FRONT STEP - NOON

The Job Hunter steps through the condo front door with an unfolded razor scooter that is rather scabby looking. He closes the door behind him and begins to scoot down the sidewalk. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
What? You were expecting a
limousine or something. Sorry to
disappoint but this is the only
form of transportation I own. In
case you didn't pick up on the
clues, I don't own a car. No,
that's not to save the environment!
My last car shot craps in 2004 just

CONTINUED: 7.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) when I needed it for a new job. I wound up taking the bus to work to try to sell vacuum cleaners door-to-door. Yes, people still do that in this day and age. Fortunately, the place I was working for at the time sent us out in vans to work small towns around the state so I only had to make it to the office in time to head out. Sales of high end items like those vacuums is not that different from the way job hunting used to feel. You keep thinking, 'Somebody's gonna buy this today. I just know it. I'm gonna make a big commission. It's gonna happen today.' It can take you a whole month of failures before you realize you just don't have the gift. It's the same way with job hunting. You keep saying, 'Look at all these jobs out there. One of them's got to want me. The next job is right around the corner. I just know it.' Sound familiar? It does to me. It was after that job that I had to scrap the car and buy the scooter for thirty bucks at Wal-mart. It used to be the only kind of secondary transport you could take on the bus, too. Last year, they added racks for bicycles to the buses. My dad even gave me one of his old bikes. Too bad somebody stole it when I went to the library to upgrade their software one day.

He reaches the condo parking lot and scoots through it to the sidewalk along the street. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
The store is within walking
distance but the scooter cuts the
time consumed in half. I may have
all kinds of time on my hands but I
have better ways to waste it than
walking around town all day, no
matter how good it may be for me.

He stops at the corner to wait for the light to change.

CONTINUED: 8.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
I suppose this jobless lifestyle
without transport does have
some...non-disadvantages. I'm
probably in better health because
I'm getting all this exercise but
there's nothing I can do with it.

The light changes and he scoots across the street, then waits at that corner for the other light to change.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
There can be no girlfriends or
boyfriends when you're broke,
unemployed, and without
transportation. I mean, what are
you gonna do? Take them to dinner
on the bus? I could probably deal
with being jobless if I wasn't also
income-less, wife-less, childless,
and girlfriend-less. I'm now in my
late forties and I am past the
point where this lifestyle grates
on me.

The light changes and he scoots across the street. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') I suppose some of you think I should take out a half dozen credit cards under a stolen social security number and just live off them....No...No. I'm not that kind. At least not yet. Maybe I'd break bad if I woke up tomorrow with cancer or something, but now? No. you should only do something if you're good at it and if you know what you're doing. I know nothing of such things and I just spent the better part of the last twenty years staring at walls. I'm trying to get away from that.

The Job Hunter reaches the front doors of-

## EXT. THE GROCERY STORE. CONTINUOUS

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
I probably could ride the scooter
through the store. There's no
posted rule against it, but I'm not
that rude.

He enters the store leaning on his scooter like a cane. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER. He picks up a basket as he enters the interior doors.

### INT. THE GROCERY STORE SOUP AISLE - CONTINUOUS

The job hunter walks down the aisle pushing his scooter beside him putting cans of soup in the basket. He uses his foot to keep the scooter from falling over when he must take his hand off of it.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') Soup is one of the things I live on. Like most of the people I know, it's usually just chicken noodle or it's permutations but I did find a good beef and potato soup that's on sale once in awhile. Today it's just chicken noodle but I'll also get some country style and chicken and dumplings. Anything to mix it up a little.

He crosses to the other side of the aisle.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') Speaking of mixing, Hamburger Helper's on sale, too. Like most college students, I learned how to make it in the dorm during all nighters and adopted it for apartment living. Never thought I'd be living on it for twenty years.

He gathers one box each of nine different flavors of Hamburger Helper into his basket.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
These ten for \$10 sales are a
godsend. I suppose some of you
think I should just go on welfare
or food stamps or something. I
actually tried to once. You see,
the thing is, back in the 90s, when
(MORE)

CONTINUED: 10.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) jobs were plentiful, I actually began sticking money away into a retirement account like people are supposed to do. Also, when my grandparents passed away, their estates were disseminated to our whole extended family and my parents and I decided to put my share into the account to live on when and if I retire. It was all a very good idea then, but now I technically have a very large cash asset which disqualifies me from being eligible for welfare or food stamps. I could close the account and use the money now but then I'd lose a bunch of it in taxes. It's the primary reason why my folks are willing to pay for all this.

### INT. THE CHECKOUT LINE IN THE GROCERY STORE - LATER

The Job Hunter places his groceries on the conveyor and steps back. The conveyor belt moves forward and the clerk begins to check them out. The Job Hunter digs into his pocket for his wallet and pulls out a credit card.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Like everything else in my life, my
food is paid for by my parents.
When the car crapped out, my
parents gave me this credit card to
pay for food and bus tickets. The
bill goes directly to them not me,
so they know if I buy anything
outside those parameters.

The Job Hunter pays for his groceries and hangs the full plastic grocery bags off of the handlebars of his scooter and pushes it toward the exit.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
They sell booze here. I suppose if
I were a drinker I could buy a lot
of that or at least find out what
kinds I like. I may have to think
about that.

### EXT. THE GROCERY STORE - A BIT LATER

The Job Hunter exits the store and begins to scoot through The parking lot around moving cars. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') I once applied to work here and pretty much anyplace I could walk to. Banks, stores, fast-food joints, but never heard a word back. My dad says that it's because I have a college degree. I think he's right. I think that these places got burned too badly in the 80's and 90's when people would come out of college with their shiny new degrees but couldn't find jobs immediately so they would go to work wherever they could and barely get trained before the corporations would snap them up. Now, when all the corporate jobs have moved overseas, we all can't get the lower level jobs because of twenty year old policies. At least, that's how it looks from here.

### EXT. THE STORE STREET CORNER - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter reaches the street corner and waits for the light to change. One of the plastic grocery bags rips out and cans of soups spill onto the sidewalk.

## JOB HUNTER

### Goddamnshittinmotherfuckinsonofabitch!!!

He leans his scooter up against the light post, ties a knot in the ripped out bag, and puts the cans back in the bag.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) Yes I  $\underline{\text{did}}$  go to middle school.

The light changes and the Job Hunter scoots across the street, then stops on the other side to wait for the light to change again. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER While he waits, he leans over to see if any of the other bags are ready to rip out.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Think I'm having a bad day? Try
doing this in the pouring rain or
the dead of winter with six inches
(MORE)

CONTINUED: 12.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) of snow or half an inch of ice or both on the ground.

The light changes and The Job Hunter scoots across the Street.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO - LATER

The front door opens and the Job Hunter pushes his scooter with the groceries into the foyer.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') What do you know? Nobody ran me over.

He takes the groceries off the handlebars and lets the scooter fall over in the foyer. He leaves it there in the middle of the floor and takes the groceries into-

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO KITCHEN - CONTINUOUS

-FOLLOW JOB HUNTER. In the kitchen, he puts the groceries away in the cupboards.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Well the cupboards are no longer
bare. I'll last a little longer in
this place. Wish I didn't always
eat by myself.

The Job Hunter returns to his computer but first leans over a table next to it where an answering machine may be seen.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)
No messages while I was out. My
resume still isn't getting me phone
calls. May as well turn the
computer back on and see if there
are anymore emails.

The Job Hunter pushes a button on the power strip, activating the computer and all it's peripherals then pushes a switch on the tower causing the computer to begin it's boot sequence. He then sits down in the chair to wait.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)
There was a buzzword being passed around the tech community a few years bac--Convergence. It basically meant that every device (MORE)

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) (cont'd) put out, be it a desktop, laptop, tablet, phone, or even a watch, would have the capability to do everything that any other device could do. So where once we needed a phone to make phone calls, a TV to watch TV, a radio to hear broadcasts, and a computer to run word processing, spreadsheets, and databases, now we would only need one device of one kind to take care of all of that. It would all depend on how big a device a person would need to function. I suppose, in that sense, life has gotten somewhat cheaper. People don't need huge stereo setups or televisions separate from their computers anymore.

The man's face grows more pensive.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) Shoot. Now I wonder how many jobs that eliminates.

The Job Hunter turns to his computer.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) Let's see if there's any new email.

The man begins to type and move his mouse around, again clicking intermittently.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) Hey, a new businessworkforce.com email. OK. Um, Home Health Aide? Nope not qualified, RN Case Manager? Don't think so. Registered Nurse? No. Registered Nurse Case Manager? I think I got the wrong email. PeopleSoft 9.1 ePerformance Developer? That's more like it. Pity that's not in my skill set. In-store Demo-Event Specialist? Oy, they want people to sell vacuum cleaners door-to-door again. Pipefitter? Not qualified. Security Officer Omaha Seasonal? I don't own a gun. Sr. Network Engineer? I'm not at that level yet. Case Manager? Not qualified. In-store (MORE)

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) (cont'd) Demo-Event Specialist? More vacuum cleaners. Convenience Banking Specialist I - FT? Probably not. Compliance Officer II-Mortgage? Nope. In-store Demo-Event Specialist? Boy they really need vacuum cleaner people. Yardhorse Driver 1st and 2nd Shift? Wonder what a Yardhorse is. Ah, it's in Valley Nebraska. It's too far away. Local OTR Driver? Still Valley NE. Director of Human Resources? Doubt I'm qualified. Distributed Command & Control Node Integrator Job? Nope. That's on the base. Probably requires security clearance. JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) There are a lot of things which hurt when you're job hunting. Rejection letters and emails, being asked what you've done since your last job ended, that look the interviewer gives you when they know you're not a good fit, being asked to fill out a job application when you show up for an interview and knowing they're judging you by how long it takes. This is one of the worst. Scammers and smugglers send this kind of stuff to take advantage of the jobless. This is a smuggler in another country trying to set up a relay for his packaged drugs. Someone would have to be pretty dense not to see it for that. What's depressing is that I know there're people desperate enough to accept it. I'm almost one of them. These don't hurt quite as bad as the brochures for fake classes, though.

The man shakes his head and goes back to work then grimaces

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) Nothing but spam now. May as well go back to YouTube

The man clicks his mouse and YouTube comes up and starts playing Robin Williams-live at the Met. Suddenly the phone RINGS and he clicks pause and picks up the phone.

JOB HUNTER
Hello....Yes, I'm aware of my
appointment in the
morning...yes...Yes. Thank you

for calling.

The man hangs up the phone, takes out his wallet, pulls a card from it, and places it on the desk in front of the monitor.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) I developed a condition in my forties that requires regular medication. After losing a job some time before my last one, my doctor recommended I get on the state sliding scale program and he filed the paperwork for me. Now I have to keep regular appointments at the downtown city health center to get my prescriptions refilled. Tomorrow is the day. The card on the monitor will remind me. Matter of fact, there's nothing else going on today, I think I'll just open Facebook.

The man types and moves his mouse around, clicking intermittently again.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) If YouTube is a poor man's cable television, Facebook is a poor man's social life. Here I can keep an eye on everybody I ever knew if they're on the network without having to go out to restaurants or bars. It's mostly a good thing. I enjoy seeing all the children and grandchildren and keeping in touch with my extended family,

The man abruptly slams his hand down on the desk.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
-but it does have it's dark side. I
get so sick and tired of the
political and religious crap. When
I was a kid, there were religious
chain letters. Now, there are
religious chain links on Facebook.
I get so sick and tired of these
compulsive Christians passing along
(MORE)

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') (cont'd) every single link on the pretense of proclaiming their love of God, though that's no where near as infuriating as the the political crap. The last president, this president, the next president-There's no real political discourse on Facebook, just vicarious cyberbullying. It's hard enough to have to elect these people without having to comb through all these barefaced lies about them every day. I don't mind when there's a shred of truth to them but all this crap about people's sexuality, racial slurs, and conspiracy theories, bug me. When did half the smart kids I went to school with turn into such white trash? Well, I know when this guy here did. It happened when he got divorced from his abusive ex and discovered that the legal system was geared to help his ex constantly hold his children over his head. For this, he hates all liberals and doesn't care who gets hurt when they go down. He doesn't know my situation. I don't think he'd care if he did. EXT. THE BUS STOP IN FRONT OF THE GROCERY STORE - DAY

The man scoots up on his scooter and folds it up then pulls out his bus schedules to look at again.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
These buses run on an near exact
schedule. If they're late, there's
usually a reason. Getting people in
wheelchairs aboard can take some
time. The only thing that really
gets me mad is when they show up
early and I arrive at the stop just
in time to watch them rolling away.
The only thing I hate more than
riding buses is waiting for buses,
and the only thing I hate more than
waiting for buses is chasing buses,
and the only thing I hate more than
chasing buses, is missing buses.

The bus rolls up and the man folds up his schedule and boards. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. THE BUS - CONTINUOUS

The man pulls out his bus ticket from his wallet and scans it. Then moves back to sit in a seat of the camera right side of the bus.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') Riding the bus in this town is time consuming.

The Job hunter looks out the window.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') It can take up to 45 minutes to get someplace on the bus where a car might take only 20 minutes. It depends on the stops and detours the bus has to make.

The bus makes a left turn.

CONTINUED: 42.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')

For instance, this bus stops at Baptist Memorial Hospital before continuing on it's way downtown

The bus stops

BUS DRIVER

Baptist Memorial Hospital

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')

Oh yeah. I forgot to mention, the driver today is the guy I call the town crier. He's one of those old school drivers who calls out the stops as he makes them. It's actually mildly entertaining

Some people get on and some off then the bus starts moving again. The Job Hunter begins to look out the window.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')

When you're job hunting, riding the bus can be a tour of old interviews.

MUSIC CUE: Jack of All Trades by Bruce Springsteen

A building marked with the Blue Cross/Blue Shield logo pass by outside the window.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')

For example, I interviewed at Blue Cross for a data entry position. Was a long time ago. Can't remember when.

BUS DRIVER

(Off screen)

College of St. Agnes. Goooooo VIXENS!

The Job Hunter smiles.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')

This guy cheers for the team of every school he drives past. As I said, mildly entertaining.

A block of shops maybe 30-40 years old passes by the window.

CONTINUED: 43.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') I interviewed in one of these buildings too. The two story one in the middle. Can't remember the name of the company though.

A boarded up gas station passes by.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
Another thing you'll see riding the
bus is a lot of dead businesses.
Gas stations, fast food, bars,
drugstores, store fronts. They just
sit there until somebody finds use
for the building or the land. Good
thing the homeless problem isn't
too big in this town.

The bus stops and a strange looking man with a backpack, a safety vest, an unremarkable shirt, and pair of pants obviously cobbled together from scrap cloth boards and sits at the front of the bus.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') I've seen this guy before. It's the pants that mark him as probably homeless. That cloth was likely originally an industrial drop cloth or the canvas from the back of a dump truck. The man clearly lives by the code of waste not want not. He doesn't smell bad so he must clean himself up at some shelter or another but I never see him wearing different clothes. The shelter's probably also where he gets tickets for the bus. My situation isn't that much better than his. I wish I could make a pair of pants out of my old employee manuals...or the rejection slips I get... Or maybe a pair of shorts out of my degree. That's about how useful it is to

BUS DRIVER (Off screen)
County health center.

The front door opens and several people begin to file on. The Job Hunter picks up his folded scooter and exits through the rear door. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

EXT. THE HEALTH CENTER BUS STOP - DAY

A line of people is seen filing onto the bus.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
This is also a long term care
facility for the disabled, mostly
former military, and many can't
drive or afford a car, so all kinds
of people board the bus here.

The Job Hunter unfolds his scooter and scoots through the parking lot to the front entrance, then steps down off the scooter and pushes it through the sliding doors. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. THE COUNTY HEALTH CENTER FOYER - CONTINUOUS.

The Job Hunter pushes his scooter to the right to a door labeled 'Outpatient', and enters it. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. THE COUNTY HEALTH CENTER OUTPATIENT OFFICE - CONTINUOUS.

The Job Hunter pushes his scooter up to the nurse's window and presents his appointment card to the nurse.

JOB HUNTER

Hi. I'm here to see Rachel.

NURSE

Yes, OK. I'll let her know you're here.

The Job Hunter pushes his scooter to a chair, sits down, and picks up a magazine while a TV plays in the background. There a few other patients in the room.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)
Rachel is a nurse practitioner who
acts as medication supervisor for
everyone with a chronic condition
who is on the sliding scale. She's
more than good enough about these
things and it makes sense to not
tie up actual doctors with people
(MORE)

CONTINUED: 45.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) (cont'd) whose diagnoses aren't going to change much, but looking around this office, it's fairly obvious that most people here don't have jobs or income either.

The nurse practitioner, RACHEL, comes through the interior door, and the Job Hunter flags her down

RACHEL

Hello, how are you today?

The Job Hunter gets up, shakes her hand, and both exit through the interior door. The Job Hunter is still pushing his scooter.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)

I'll spare you the boring details. It's mostly just her making sure I'm not having any bad reactions to the meds. How am I sleeping. How am I eating. Is there anything terrible happening in my life. That sort of thing.

TIME CUT TO LATER

INT. THE COUNTY HEALTH CENTER OUTPATIENT OFFICE - CONTINUOUS.

Rachel and the Job Hunter enter through the interior door.

RACHEL

See you again in three months?

JOB HUNTER

That'll be fine.

Rachel goes back through the interior door and the Job Hunter goes to the nurse's window.

JOB HUNTER (CONT')

The next appointment in three months please.

NURSE

All right.

The nurse types on her keyboard

CONTINUED: 46.

NURSE (CON'T)

Thursday the 18th at 2:40?

The Job Hunter checks his bus schedule.

JOB HUNTER

That'll be fine.

The nurse hands him an appointment card.

NURSE

We'll see you then.

JOB HUNTER

Yeah, see you.

The Job Hunter takes the card and pushes his scooter out the office door. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER

INT. THE COUNTY HEALTH CENTER FOYER - CONTINUOUS.

He turns to the right and walks to a window labeled Accounts Receivable

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) Being on the state sliding scale in this state means that I have to drop some money into my account every time I come down here. I usually just give whatever change I have in my pockets.

He leans against the window. The woman on the other side is elderly with very little hair. Likely a cancer survivor.

JOB HUNTER

I'd like to put some money on my account.

CASHIER

(Handing him a card)

Fill out the card.

The man begins filling out the card.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)

The state sliding scale doesn't mean I don't pay for anything. It just means they let the charges go into an account and build up until I can pay them. It was a good idea when they first did it. It let

(MORE)

CONTINUED: 47.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) (cont'd) people put off the medical expenses until they could get another job -when there were jobs to be had. These days, you can go years between jobs and the account will build up to thousands of dollars.

The Job Hunter hands over the card and his money and the woman begins to fill out a receipt.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
The last statement I got from them
had my total up to six thousand
some dollars and if I don't make
regular deposits, however small, it
goes to a collection agency. I
don't even wanna get started on
what that would be like.

The man takes his receipt and heads for the door.

EXT. THE HEALTH CENTER FRONT DOOR - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter scoots out the door and through the parking lot to the street.

EXT. THE STREET IN FRONT OF THE HEALTH CENTER - CONTINUOUS

The man stands waiting at the side of the street while all kinds of traffic drives past.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
The worst part of coming down here
is trying to get across this street
to the other bus stop.

He sees the bus coming and steps into the street forcing traffic to slow and stop.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') As soon as I see that bus coming, I stop being polite and safe. I'll scoot out into traffic and they can all slow down and stop for the crazy guy on the scooter.

The Job Hunter scoots across the street and the bus stops as he scoots in front of it. The front of the bus looms over him as he scoots around it to the bus's door which opens to let him in. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER to-

INT. THE BUS - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter lets his ticket scan then lifts his scooter up to fold it while he walks back to his seat.

EXT. THE BUS STOP - LATER

The Job Hunter gets off the bus at a stop across a vacant lot from his condo, unfolds his scooter and scoots around the lot to his condo.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM - LATER

The Job Hunter pushes his scooter through the front door and closes it behind him, then walks over to his computer and notices his answering machine is blinking.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Hey, I got a message.

The Job Hunter pushes the play button.

ANSWERING MACHINE

Hi, My name is Brad at Umbrella. We're looking to expand our operation in this area and I saw your resume online. Contact me at 402-325-3562 if you are still looking and you have some time to talk go over some details.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Hey, I've got a callback.

The Job Hunter grabs the phone, plays the message again, and dials the number as the machine recites it. He turns on his computer while waiting for the connection.

JOB HUNTER

Yes, hello, this is he. I understand you wanted to talk to me.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)

The guy spoke my name the minute he answered the phone. Must've read it off caller ID.

JOB HUNTER

Yes. I'm still looking...Well, I've mostly been looking for an IT (MORE)

CONTINUED: 49.

JOB HUNTER (cont'd) position but I'm open to other kinds of work...I see...Well sure I can meet with you to discuss it. When's a good time for you?...Sure, I can be there tomorrow...Well, all right then...

The Job Hunter clicks his mouse to bring something up.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)

(Typing as he speaks)
Ok, let me get this down...
Tomorrow, at 11:00, at the Apollo's at 14th and Harney. Look for Brad from Umbrella. Hokay Brad, I'll look forward to talking to you tomorrow. You need me to bring anything?...All right then, I'll talk to you tomorrow. Right. Bye now.

He hangs up the phone.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Well, what do you know? I actually have an interview. Now I have to go get a haircut and remember to shave all this beard off tomorrow morning.

The Job Hunter pulls out his bus schedule and reads it.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Looks like I'll have to go now if I wanna get my hair cut before close.

He clicks his mouse to shut down the computer and gets up to leave.

MONTAGE - VARIOUS

A) EXT. THE FRONT OF A SUPERCUTS HAIR SALON - AFTERNOON

The Job Hunter exits the salon with his hair cut short.

B) INT. A FED-EX STORE PUBLIC COMPUTER ROOM - DAY

He sits down at a public computer, swipes his debit card to activate it and plugs in a flash drive.

CUT TO the printer. The Job Hunter pulls freshly printed resumes off the printer and puts them in his briefcase.

- C) INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BEDROOM EVENING

  He pulls his blue suit out of the closet and runs a lint
  roller over it.
- D) INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM-EVENING

The Job Hunter irons his white shirt.

E) INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BATHROOM - EVENING

He hangs his suit, tie, and shirt in the bathroom.

- F) INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO KITCHEN EVENING The Job Hunter sets his alarm for the next morning.
- G) INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BEDROOM NIGHT The Job Hunter goes to bed.

END OF MONTAGE

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BATHROOM - MORNING

The Job Hunter begins to shave off two months worth of beard with his electric shaver.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)
Long time job hunters like me will
use all kinds of techniques to give
ourselves an edge in an interview.
For instance, I'll let my hair and
beard grow out between job
interviews so that when I get
called in for one, I feel cleaner
after having my hair cut and

CONTINUED: 51.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) (cont'd) shaving when I haven't for a long period of time.

TIME CUT TO LATER

The Job Hunter is now shaved, showered, groomed, and dressed in his shirt and suit. His collar is still open at the top and he threads his tie through it before looking down at his watch.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)
Aw man! Is that the time. God!! How
do I keep doing this to myself!!

He grabs his tie clasp and lapel pin and sticks them in his vest pocket while racing out the door. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO FOYER - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter swiftly puts on his formal shoes without taking the time to tie them, sticks the laces in his sock, grabs his unfolded scooter and briefcase while racing out the door.

EXT. THE FRONT DOOR OF THE CONDO - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter charges out the door and scoots at top speed down the sidewalk to the corner with the briefcase hanging off the handlebar. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) As you can tell this has happened to me a few times. I once ripped the back of these pants out scooting after the bus. Luckily, my mother is old school and knows how to sew up damaged clothing. I don't think there's any kind of clothing she hasn't fixed at one time or another.

The Job Hunter reaches the corner and looks up the street. The bus is as far away as it can be and still be visible but is on the way. To board, he will have to cross the street which currently has the green light. He turns and scoots across the street with the red light and pushes the button on the light post. Luck is with him and the light changes before the bus crosses the intersection. The Job Hunter scoots across the street and up to-

EXT. THE BUS STOP IN FRONT OF THE GROCERY STORE - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter pulls out his wallet and gets out his bus ticket just as the bus pulls up. He boards the bus. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER.

INT. THE BUS - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter lets his ticket scan then pushes his scooter back to an empty seat, sets it and the briefcase there, then turns to his reflection to finish dressing himself.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') Well that was close. I hate when that happens.

He struggles to button the top button of his shirt.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') As rare as these job interviews are, getting off to a bad start can disrupt your whole state of mind.

The Job Hunter looks briefly stricken, then shakes it off and begins to tie his necktie.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
I have to refuse to give credence
to things like luck and jinxes and
foreboding and renew my
determination to succeed.

The Job Hunter finishes tieing his necktie.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
I once dropped my tie in the street
racing to a bus stop. Didn't
realize it until I was on the bus.
Had to do the interview without it.
Found it in the street on the way
home that afternoon. It's still
hanging in my closet with a big
skid mark on it. I don't know what
to do with it.

The man pulls his tie clasp and lapel pin from his vest pocket. He uses the clasp to clip his tie to his shirt.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
The tie clasp is one of many things
I inherited from my grandfather
when he passed away. I wear it for
luck.

CONTINUED: 53.

He pins the pin to his lapel.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT')
The pin I got from my first long
term corporate job for being a so
called key player. Wish I hadn't
lost my eagle scout pin.

The Job Hunter plants one foot on the seat and ties his shoe, then the other, then straightens up and checks his reflection, then straightens his suit a bit.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)(CONT') I am as ready as I ever get for an interview and I have another half hour to get into my zone before we reach downtown.

He sits down in his seat and places his hands on the handlebars of his scooter like it was a cane and looks professional.

EXT. THE DOWNTOWN AREA - DAY

The bus rolls down the street unremarkably past a series of street corners some with collections of protesters on them. Inside-

INT. THE BUS - SIMULTANEOUS

- The Job Hunter reaches up and pulls the cord to signal the bus to stop. Outside-

EXT. THE BUS STOP - SECONDS LATER

-the bus rolls to a stop. The Job Hunter gets off and walks down the street past more groups of protesters to a coffee shop labeled 'Apollo's' which he enters.

INT. APOLLO'S COFFEE SHOP - SECONDS LATER

The Job Hunter walks up to the counter.

JOB HUNTER

Hello. I'm here to meet with Brad from Umbrella.

CONTINUED: 54.

BARISTA

In the corner by the window.

JOB HUNTER

Thank you.

The Job Hunter walks to the table indicated and meets BRAD, a short bearded man about his own height wearing a blue denim collared shirt, brown leather jacket, black pants, and loafers.

JOB HUNTER

Brad?

Brad stands up and extends his hand to shake which the Job Hunter takes.

**BRAD** 

Nice to meet you-

A waitress passes in front of them and a random restaurant noise drowns out the sound of the Job Hunter's name.

BRAD (CON'T)

Sit on down, have some coffee, and let's talk.

The Job Hunter sits down and Brad pours him a cup of coffee.

JOB HUNTER

So, what's this job you might have for me?

BRAD

Umbrella is an insurance company that is on the cutting edge of the industry. We are the premier company for business and property insurance in the country. Now the position we're hiring for is one of our local sales agents. These people work from home and what they do is call everyone they know and try to interest them in the insurance we offer. One of our most successful agents was a high school teacher who sold to all his fellow faculty. He made enough to retire from teaching early. Now, when a new agent starts out, it's best to work with people they're in regular contact with, like close family and friends they hang out with a lot. This allows them to perfect their technique before moving out into people they might not have spoken to in awhile. Now, if you...(actor free to ad lib)

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

I can't believe this guy wasted my time like this.

BRAD

...now, do you have any questions?

JOB HUNTER

Would I be paid a salary or would my pay be all commission-based?

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Hey, I'm not too proud to try it for awhile if they're paying me.

**BRAD** 

All compensation is commission based but once you build your customer base...(actor free to ad lib)

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

In short, I'm expected to build their business for them and they cut me in for a negligible share.

JOB HUNTER

What kind of training is there for new agents?

CONTINUED: 56.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Maybe I can get some money out of this if I just get trained.

BRAD

We issue a manual to all new agents and then coach them until they're up to standards.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Thought so. I'm supposed to jump in feet first and hit the ground running, even though they know this isn't in my skill set.

**BRAD** 

Does this sound like something you could do?

JOB HUNTER

I'm sorry, Brad, it doesn't. I tried selling vacuum cleaners door to door once and that was all the sales I could stand. I don't even apply for phone sale positions. Thank you for the coffee and the meeting and everything but I'm gonna have to say no.

The Job Hunter picks up his things and stands up.

**BRAD** 

Are you sure? A lot of people think they can't do this until they try, then they find out they can.

JOB HUNTER

I've been down this road before. I'm sorry but the only thing this will do is distract from the hunt for paying work.

Brad stands up and offers his hand to shake.

**BRAD** 

Well, I'm sorry if I wasted your time.

The Job Hunter shifts all his stuff to one hand and shakes Brad's hand with the other.

CONTINUED: 57.

JOB HUNTER

Ah, it's OK. It got me out of the house.

**BRAD** 

Well, good luck finding work.

JOB HUNTER

Yeah, and good luck filling this position.

The Job Hunter takes his coffee and leaves. FOLLOW JOB HUNTER. As the Job Hunter is leaving the cafe, he throws his coffee into the trash.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.)

I hate coffee.

The Job Hunter exits the cafe.

EXT. DOWNTOWN - AFTERNOON

The air is filled with speeches from political rallies and counter rallies.

The Job Hunter sees the bus across the street about to leave the stop and races like hell for the corner to intercept it. The bus passes the corner and the Job Hunter arrives only after he can do no more than stare impotently after it. He almost throws his stuff angrily to the ground but stops himself.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

(yells)

Goddammit!! I hate missing buses!!

The Job Hunter crosses the street and walks to-

EXT. THE BUS STOP - CONTINUOUS

-to wait for the bus. Behind him may be seen the park in which political demonstrations and counter demonstrations by groups along the lines of Occupy and the TEA Party are taking place. The Job Hunter frowns and grimaces as he listens to the various diatribes (actors free to ad lib) boosted by loudspeakers and megaphones until finally he hears the word 'lazy' and can't bear it anymore. He walks to-

# EXT. THE PARK ENTRANCE - CONTINUOUS

-where he takes a Guy Fawkes mask from a box of them that is sitting there and puts it on before entering-

#### EXT. THE PARK - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter begins to push through the crowd toward the stage where a speaker is ranting into a microphone at counter demonstrators some of whom have megaphones. (actors free to ad lib) When he gets to the side of the stage, he drops his belongings, gets up onto the stage, and before anyone can stop him, grabs the microphone from the speaker and-

JOB HUNTER

(bellows into the microphone) Will you people shut the fuck uuuuuuupp!!!

Feedback erupts from all the loudspeakers and everyone in the park covers their ears in pain.

JOB HUNTER NARRATING(V.O.) Hey, isn't this where you all came in? Well if you're still here, you might as well hear what I had to say.

JOB HUNTER

(yells)

Before I start, I'd like to know if anybody here can hook me up with a job as a paid protester...ok just raise your hand and I'll come talk to you!!(hears laughter) I'm not laughing!!! (feedback again) You think I'm here to make think I'm here to make you laugh?!(turns to his right) Will you put away those goddamn phones!!! (more feedback) Did you kids even work for the money to buy those?!! Has it occurred to you that one day you're going to have to?! I'd get used to finding ways to make the technology you have now last as long as you can! It won't be that long before you have to stretch that phone as far as it goes! (turns to his left) Aw shut up!!! (more feedback) Fuck you and the aborted fetuses you (MORE)

CONTINUED: 59.

JOB HUNTER (cont'd) never gave a shit about in the first place!!! I got a an old work buddy who goes down to children's town every weekend to coach football for the unaborted fetuses who live there and he never sees any of you!! But then they're God's responsibility once they're born, aren't they?!! The most you need to do is pray for them, right? Forget about them getting homes and jobs and families, you can't be bothered to give them a bit of your time!! You don't have to adopt them, but you just could be a part of their lives, if it wouldn't take time out of your busy schedule of coming to events like this to listen to yourselves shout!! (to his right) You kids shut up, too!! (more feedback) Has it occurred to any of you that the tax dollars they cry about all the time are food out of their kids mouths and dollars they can't put toward their own children's education?!! Who's going to put their kids through college?!! I'll tell ya who: you are!! In ten to twenty years when you're where they are and they're where your parents are!!! (to the left)And you people!! (more feedback) How is it they should not be demanding jobs or even careers?!! Isn't that supposed to be the point of going to college in the first place?!! I came out of a big name college twenty years ago with a computer science degree and haven't been able to get a job programming for the last ten!! I have no prison record, drug or alcohol history, bankruptcy, political activism, or anything else that would mark me as unhireable!! You people seem to have all the answers. When did the American dream become the American fantasy?!! Can you tell me why i fill out applications and send out resumes every day and get maybe three interviews in a year?!! I (MORE)

CONTINUED: 60.

JOB HUNTER (cont'd) even lowered my standards in 2001 to take phone work!! It's still just three interviews a year, if that!!! Don't hand me that crap about the last president!!! It was just as bad under the one before!!! Hell it was worse!!! (more feedback) If you actually got a job the company would move overseas and the facility would close!!! What's a college degree worth really?!! To anyone?!! People tell me I should start a business!! I don't know how to run a business!! Why don't colleges teach that to students in addition to everything else?!! You people are all bellyaching about taxes and presidents while people like me are sitting at home watching our lives go by and our skills decay while somebody else pays our bills!! You all drove here didn't you?!! There isn't single person here who doesn't own a car, is there?!! Oh, some of you may know what it's like to do without a car while it gets fixed or tried to get two people to work with one car, but you still had a car!!! You've never tried to get by on the bus for years at a time. You've never tried it for a month!!! But then that's my issue isn't it?!! (points into the crowd) That's the way it works isn't it, Dave?!! Yeah I see you there!! That's what you posted on facebook and you know it!!! It's what I saw you post!!! It's the kind of guy you are and always were!!!

## ON THE CROWD

A visibly furious man leaves the TEA party-like crowd and begins to shove his way through the crowd until a cop stops him.

### ON THE JOB HUNTER

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)
(to the right) And you people!! (more feedback) Take a good long look at
(MORE)

CONTINUED: 61.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T) (cont'd) me kids cause here's where you're going to end!! Especially if those people have anything to do with it!! (points to left) This is the same suit my parents gave me when I graduated twenty years ago!! There're holes in the cuffs now, (he shows these) a rip up the back of the pant leg, (he points to his ankle) and a hole worn in the tie (he tears at his tie)Where every job interviewer can notice them!!! The designer shirt and belt weathered a little better but the shoes ripped out years ago!! How am I supposed to finance another \$500 suit without an income?!! Your parents sent you to college because they thought it would get you a better life than they had or at least one just as good!! Instead it just gave you a \$40,000 piece of paper to hang on your wall!! You girls should learn how to swing from poles wearing bikinis cause that's the only growth industry left in this town that I've seen!! Not sure what you guys could do now!! We all could have learned to deal drugs or steal identities or cars or something else less than legal, but no, we had to try it the honest way!! The way our parents would have wanted us to!! They tell us no one owes us anything so I quess that means no one owes those homeless disabled vets that I see down at the county health center anything either!! (to the left) That's another place I never see any of you!!!(more feedback)

#### ON THE CROWD

A line of uniformed police officers begin to move in on the stage. The Job Hunter turns to the right and sees another one moving in from that direction. The same from the left. A girl approaches the Job Hunter from behind and grabs the arm which holds the mic, making him turn to look at her. Their conversation is picked up by the mic.

CONTINUED: 62.

GIRL

You better get outa here. It sounds you can't afford bail.

The Job Hunter surrenders the mic and the stand.

JOB HUNTER

Guess not. Still it's three squares a day, free clothes, and bed.

The Job Hunter withdraws to the side of the stage where he left his belongings while the girl launches into a fresh tirade (actress free to ad lib) and members of the crowd around the stage link arms to prevent the police from advancing. The Job Hunter drops to the ground, gathers his belongings, and peers through the crowd looking for the easiest way out. He sees the police line getting closer and ducks beneath the skirt of the stage.

### INT. UNDER THE STAGE - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter peals off the mask and looks around. He leaves the mask and crawls around the supports to the rear of the stage and peeks out between the curtains. He sees the line of linked demonstrators some of whom are in suits with Guy Fawkes masks preparing for the approaching police. The Job Hunter crawls out from under the stage-

### EXT. BEHIND THE STAGE -CONTINUOUS

-and crouch-walks behind the line trying to find his way out, until he walks straight into a female protesters chest. He looks up and sees it belongs to a very beautiful Caucasian girl in her mid-twenties wearing a unzipped hoody. She kneels down next to of him.

PROTESTER GIRL

(whispers)

Keep low. I'll get you out of here.

She straightens his tie and shirt, then pulls out a comb and runs it through his hair.

PROTESTER GIRL(CON'T)

(whispers)

Take off your jacket and give it to me.

He does so. She folds it in half, places it on his right shoulder and places his right hand on it, then places his briefcase in his left hand and takes his folded scooter, CONTINUED: 63.

then takes off her hoodie, turns it inside out, puts it back on, zips it up to cover her protest shirt, then picks up the scooter.

PROTESTER GIRL(CON'T)

(whispers)

Keep low and follow me.

They crouch-walk along the line until they hear a ruckus on the other side of the park

EXT. ACROSS THE PARK - CONTINUOUS

A protester pushes through the police line.

PROTESTER

Where the fuck's that fucking baby killing pussy who-(actor free to ad lib)

EXT. BEHIND THE STAGE -CONTINUOUS

Taking advantage of the cops all looking the other way, The Protester Girl pushes through the protest line and pulls the Job Hunter behind her. As soon as she's clear of the police line, she looks around and, once she's sure no one is looking, turns and hugs him.

PROTESTER GIRL

Hi Honey.

Before he can stop her, she kisses him fiercely.

PROTESTER GIRL(CON'T)

The show's just about over here. I was hoping you'd find me. How was your interview.

The Job Hunter looks stricken.

JOB HUNTER

I'd rather not talk about it.

PROTESTER GIRL

Aw, c'mon. You know you got the job.

JOB HUNTER

Can we not talk about this here?

CONTINUED: 64.

PROTESTER GIRL Sure, let's get some coffee instead.

She drags him by the hand to Apollo's coffee shop and through the front door to-

INT. APOLLO'S COFFEE SHOP - CONTINUOUS

They hurry through the front door, walk to the back of the shop, and the Job Hunter leans his back against a wall. He is visibly stressed. He sets his things down on a vacant table and opens his briefcase, which is full of old employment manuals and other papers. He takes off his suit coat, folds it, then puts it in the briefcase. It is quickly followed by his tie and tie clasp. He quickly closes his case when he hears a police siren WOOP-WOOP outside the shop. He unbuttons his shirt down to his belt, picks up his things, then turns to the girl, to see her walking up with coffee for both of them.

PROTESTER GIRL Here, you look like a chocolate coffee guy.

The Job Hunter accepts the coffee and takes a drink.

JOB HUNTER

Hey...Hey that's actually pretty good. And I hate coffee. Thanks. Thanks for ...everything.

She smiles but He turns away.

PROTESTER GIRL Hey, where are you going?

JOB HUNTER

Out the back.

PROTESTER GIRL (following him)
This place has a back?

They exit through the back door.

INT. THE OLD MALL -CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter hurries forward but stops and ducks behind a pillar when he sees police cars passing in front of the malls big picture windows, then he looks around.

PROTESTER GIRL

What is this place?

JOB HUNTER

An old mall. It used to be a corporate headquarters until the company moved down by the river. This place was sold for mall and office space before the economy tanked.

He looks around.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)

Weird. Now it has it's own unique form of quiet. Empty stores and food places all together in one place.

The Job Hunter begins to walk around.

JOB HUNTER (CONT')

Most of the doors are locked but you can still push your way out. They leave that door to the coffee shop open so prospective renters can have a look at the property when they want. I came downtown for an interview once in the winter and went into the coffee shop to warm up. The barista told me this was the easiest way to get to the bus stop. It sure beat waiting in the cold.

PROTESTER GIRL

Did you use to hang out here.

JOB HUNTER

No. Way out of my way, but I always knew it was here. Now it's just another place where people use to work and don't anymore. The whole city's full of them. That used to be a flagship department store across the street. Now, it's all luxury condos.

CONTINUED: 66.

PROTESTER GIRL Is that why you came to the protest?

JOB HUNTER

I didn't come to the protest. I came downtown for an interview, or so I thought. It turned out the guy wanted me to call anyone I'd ever known and try to sell his insurance to them. I tried commission based sales before. A couple of times. Unless you're actually good at it, it's a waste of everybody's time. I only got up on that stage because of what those people were saying about being lazy! (yells) What do they know about working hard?!! For nothing?!!! For years?!!!

The last word echos back from the empty mall and The Job Hunter stops though he's still breathing heavily through clenched teeth. The Protester girl steps up behind him.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)

(hisses)

They think they get to call us <a href="losers">losers</a>! Because we didn't get the same results they did when we started adulthood! (stops hissing) sorry.

He turns to her.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)

It's just been twenty-five years since I graduated college and I'm still competing for entry level positions.

(Looks her over) How old are you?

PROTESTER GIRL

Huh?

JOB HUNTER

How old are you?

PROTESTER GIRL

(Shrugs)

23.

CONTINUED: 67.

JOB HUNTER

See, you hadn't even been born when I graduated college. I got friends from high school who have kids your age. Some of them even have grandchildren. And I just had my first kiss right out there in the street.

PROTESTER GIRL

(Shocked)

Your first kiss!

JOB HUNTER

Is that so strange? In college, I was too busy trying to succeed to do much more than talk to people in the cafeteria, then I was always broke and unemployed, then my car shot craps in 2004 and I had to get everywhere on the bus. What was I supposed to do? Take a date to dinner on the bus-

She cuts him off with another fierce ambush kiss. When they break, the Job Hunter sits wearily down on a bench behind him. She sits down next to him. They both set down their coffee.

JOB HUNTER

You're very nice, you know? So very nice about... things.

The girl places her hand on his crotch.

PROTESTER GIRL

We could do more than kiss, you know.

The Job Hunter moves her hand.

JOB HUNTER

No... No I'd never feel right about it. It could lead to a child, and I'd never forgive myself if I put you in that position. My parents would get involved and they're already paying all of my bills-

She cuts him off with a kiss again.

CONTINUED: 68.

PROTESTER GIRL

(Soothingly)

Hey...it's OK. Besides-

A zipper is heard UNZIPPING

PROTESTER GIRL(CON'T)

(Devilishly)

There's other things men and women can do together.

She lowers her head to his lap and he GROANS as she begins.

TIME CUT TO LATER

There is a ZIP sound as they finish. She grins up at him from between his knees.

PROTESTER GIRL

Don't worry. I didn't mess up your good pants.

The Job Hunter smiles lovingly down at her and strokes her hair.

JOB HUNTER

I wish we could just stay here forever. I wish there was no world out there that we somehow had to succeed in.

PROTESTER GIRL

Especially with those people out there.

JOB HUNTER

Yeah. Worst thing is, those are the people you're gonna have to deal with in the workplace. The sexists, the racists, the homophobes, the harassers, they do it just because they can...and get away with it.

PROTESTER GIRL

Can't people just file complaints?

JOB HUNTER

Well, they can, but it doesn't do much good from what I've seen. Most of these guys are really smart about things. They'll choose people they know that aren't as productive as they are or don't have as much (MORE)

CONTINUED: 69.

JOB HUNTER (cont'd)

seniority. Sometimes, they'll even hire them into positions specifically for that purpose. They're like most predators. They know how to pick prey. These days they just need people more desperate for work than dignity.

PROTESTER GIRL

Who did that to you?

JOB HUNTER

Gratefully nobody, but my friends weren't so lucky.

She pulls out her phone and presses a button then looks at him, almost shocked.

PROTESTER GIRL

You don't have phone, do you.

JOB HUNTER

Who would pay for it?

PROTESTER GIRL

Usually, when I meet somebody I want to stay in touch with, I scan their phone to get their number.

JOB HUNTER

(holding out hand)

Here.

She hands him the phone and he enters his information before handing it back.

PROTESTER GIRL

Will I see you again?

pause

JOB HUNTER

I'd like to, but I'm old enough to be your father. You should be with someone your own age...who's gonna go through all the same changes you are, at the same time you are. I've never heard of a relationship with an age gap like ours working out. Never heard of one period really. Unless you count Donald Trump.

CONTINUED: 70.

PROTESTER GIRL

(Grimaces)

Ew!

He smiles.

JOB HUNTER

(laughs)

Bad example, really.

They LAUGH together.

pause

She climbs up onto his lap.

PROTESTER GIRL

I still want us to try being together. Are you on Facebook?

JOB HUNTER

I am, actually.

PROTESTER GIRL

Good. I'm going to send you invitations and we're going to meet again, someplace.

JOB HUNTER

Do you have a job?

PROTESTER GIRL

What's that got to do with anything?

JOB HUNTER

One of us should have a job, or at least some form of income. Do you have a car?

PROTESTER GIRL

Yes.

JOB HUNTER

I don't. I have to get to places on the bus. If we're going to meet at places, you'll have to remember that. We also don't get to do things we can't pay for. How do you pay for gas? CONTINUED: 71.

PROTESTER GIRL

How is that any of your-

She slaps both her hands on both his shoulders.

PROTESTER GIRL(CON'T)

(angrily)

I can't believe I blew you!

JOB HUNTER

Yeah, that surprised me, too. My first kiss, my first sexual experience, and my first breakup in the space of an hour.

PROTESTER GIRL

I didn't say we were breaking up. That's if we're even together.

JOB HUNTER

Lover's spat, then?

PROTESTER GIRL

Maybe. Look, just try to sound a little less like my parents, OK?

JOB HUNTER

Given our age difference, I don't know as that's going to happen.

Pause.

JOB HUNTER (CONT')

I'm sorry.

PROTESTER GIRL

It's OK, and hey, don't worry about it. We'll find things we can do together.

JOB HUNTER

Maybe, but one of us should have a job. Take it from me kid, you don't wanna live under your parents roof for any longer than you have to.

PROTESTER GIRL

But what about all those people you were talking about? You know, the...workplace predators?

CONTINUED: 72.

JOB HUNTER

That doesn't give us an excuse to give up. We don't get to do that, honey. We don't get to just stop trying. The day we do that is the day everything those people out there said is true. The American system works in this way, sweetie: you go to school, get good grades, get into college, get marketable skills, graduate, get a job-no, get a career, and have an income. The problem now is that there's a disconnect in that system someplace that destroying the lives of half my generation and probably all of yours. I-

She interrupts him with a kiss again.

PROTESTER GIRL

I really wanna keep knowing you. You're so woke.

JOB HUNTER

Woke?

She GIGGLES.

PROTESTER GIRL

You have such a...grasp of things.

JOB HUNTER

Oh. Well, it comes from having a lot of time to stare at them.

She smiles and another police siren WOOP-WOOP is heard outside.

JOB HUNTER

We should get out of here before we're discovered.

She kisses him and gets up.

PROTESTER GIRL

I meant what I said. I wanna talk to you tonight on Facebook.

JOB HUNTER

I'll like that.

CONTINUED: 73.

They look at each other fondly and she picks up her coffee and takes a drink from it as she walks back toward the coffee shop. He picks up his coffee and drains it, then tosses the cup in a garbage can as he heads the other direction.

The Job Hunter steps behind a pillar near some exterior double doors to a avoid being seen by police cars passing by outside. He suddenly looks to his right. FOLLOW JOB HUNTERS GAZE. Through the exterior window may be seen a parked modest red SUV with a black man in shades dressed business casual, MARK, in the drivers seat. The man points to the Job Hunter and gestures for him to come. The Job Hunter leaves without hesitation.

EXT. THE STREET OUTSIDE THE OLD MALL -DAY

The Job Hunter leans over and looks in the red SUV's open window.

JOB HUNTER

Mark?

MARK

Just get in the dam car!

The Job Hunter gets into the vehicle.

INT. MARK'S SUV - DAY.

The Job Hunter is in the passenger seat.

MARK

Duck down and stay down. I'll let you know when it's safe.

Mark puts on a baseball cap with the logo of a local college football team on it and a pair of shades.

JOB HUNTER

What are you doing?

MARK

Nobody pulls over a Harvester fan in this town.

Mark starts driving. FOLLOW SUV

## EXT. THE DOWNTOWN AREA - SECONDS LATER

Mark's SUV pulls into an alley and quietly slides up a hill to come out the other end. It then enters a parking garage and goes up and down the ramps. It is about to go out the exit when a cop car is seen outside and it just goes around again.

INT. MARK'S SUV - SIMULTANEOUS

JOB HUNTER

What are we doing?

MARK

Just stay down.

JOB HUNTER

They didn't see my face.

MARK

You don't know what they saw. Stay down.

The Job Hunter stays down.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Mark is my best friend from college and the most streetwise person I know. He's exactly the kind of person I'd want to get me out of a situation like this.

EXT. THE DOWNTOWN AREA - DAY

The SUV exits the parking garage. FOLLOW SUV. It heads up a hill and past a cop car who's occupants watch it drive by as Mark scrupulously keeps his eye's on the road. The SUV drives down the hill, onto a bridge over the interstate, and takes a left onto an onramp.

INT. MARK'S SUV - SIMULTANEOUS

MARK

You can sit up now.

The Job Hunter sits up and looks at Mark, who takes off the cap and throws it contemptuously into the back.

CONTINUED: 75.

JOB HUNTER

How'd you know?

MARK

That rally's all over the Internet. You're all over the Internet. You've gone viral. I been talking on the phone with you since college, but I knew it was you when you started talking about the suit. I thought I was gonna have to come down here and bail you out of jail. I just lucked across you at the old mall. Since when do you attend rallys? You were never that kind of political.

JOB HUNTER

I <u>didn't</u> attend. I just went to what I thought was gonna be a job interview, then missed the bus home, then one of those people called job hunters lazy, and I just...

MARK

...went boom?

JOB HUNTER

Yeah.

MARK

I'll never say you got no spine again.

pause.

JOB HUNTER

You off work today?

MARK

Hell, no. I was supposed to be
planning the store in Valley today.
I have to- (Actor free to ad lib)

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

A few years ago, Mark was in the same boat I was, then he got hired to set up computer systems in convenience stores in this part of the state. It'd be great for him if the company wasn't run by a bunch of racist, right wingnut, fake news (MORE)

CONTINUED: 76.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.) (cont'd) junkies who have to swallow hard every day to admit that they need the help of a non-Caucasian to run their business.

MARK

-I'll just tell them I got caught in the rally traffic.

JOB HUNTER

Yeah. Thanks for coming out for me man.

MARK

Sure.

JOB HUNTER

I take it it's gotten no easier with those people?

MARK

You mean, 'do I still think they'll hang me from a tree the day they think they can get away with it?', Hell yeah, but I'll take their money if it means Mama keeps getting her treatments.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Mark stayed on this job for the benefits so his mother won't die without her treatments. He's even been attacked on the job. There are supposed to be laws in place to allow people to sue such employers for creating hostile working conditions, but those who want to keep working know better. Nobody hires a whistleblower of any kind. Just because blacklisting's illegal doesn't mean it isn't practiced. Suddenly flashing lights are seen in the window behind them.

MARK JOB HUNTER

Aw shit!

Aw shit!

EXT. AN OVERPASS ON THE INTERSTATE - DAY

MUSIC CUE: 41 shots by Bruce Springsteen

Mark pulls his car over on the overpass and the police car pulls up behind him.

INT. MARK'S SUV - DAY.

Mark places his hands on steering wheel.

MARK

Put your hands on the dash board...now.

The Job Hunter does this.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Mark knows I think he's a little paranoid about things, but I do what I can to set his mind at ease while riding with him.

The police officer walks up to the window and Mark rolls it down.

COP

Afternoon, sir. You know why I pulled you over today?

MARK

(nervously)

Um...actually no sir.

COP

Well, you pulled that lane change too quick back there and you failed to signal it. Now where you headed today?

MARK

(still nervously)

W-what can I do for you?

COP

I asked you a question. I asked you where you're going to today!

MARK

You need my license?

Mark doesn't move. The cop moves his hand to his gun.

CONTINUED: 78.

COP

Did I ask you for anything else? When I ask for it, I'll ask for your driver's license, your registration, and your proof of insurance! What I didn't ask for is an attitude.

MARK

(worried now)

OK.

COP

Why don't you hand me your information. Who does the vehicle belong to?

pause.

COP (CON'T)

Who does the vehicle belong to?

MARK

It's a company car. My supervisor sent me to Valley NE today to set up a shop and I picked up my buddy here from a job interview downtown on my way back.

JOB HUNTER

There's a business card in my briefcase if you need to verify the interview, sir.

COP

When I want to hear from you sir, I'll address you.

The Job Hunter looks away looking like he hopes he hasn't made things worse.

COP (CON'T)

So the company gave you permission to operate the vehicle?

MARK

Yes.

COP

Do you have the registration for this vehicle and proof of insurance? CONTINUED: 79.

MARK

I can check the glove box.

COP

This information needs to be readily available. You got any drugs in the car?

MARK

(louder than he intends)

No! Sir.

COP

(Attempting to reassure)

Ok. Ok. Any weapon.

MARK

(more controlled)

No.

The officer reaches in and unbuckles Mark's seat belt.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

The Hell?

COP

Let's get you out of there and give this car a search.

He grabs ahold of Mark.

MARK

Hey, wait a minute!

COP

Stop resisting!

The cop pulls Mark from the car. Looking determined, the Job Hunter unbuckles his seat belt, opens the car door, and steps out of the car.

EXT. AN OVERPASS ON THE INTERSTATE - DAY

The cop almost has Mark cuffed when he notices the Job Hunter walk up to the overpass splashboard, step over it, and turn around to face them with the traffic passing beneath him at his back.

COP

Hey, what do you think you're doing?!

The Job Hunter points at the cop.

CONTINUED: 80.

JOB HUNTER

(Loud enough to be heard over the traffic)

You're not from here!! I've been pulled over five or six times when I had a car and I've never even heard of a cop as bad as you! You got kicked out of last department and maybe the one before that and came here to show the hick local cops how to do things right, didn't you! Well, I've spent the last twenty years applying for jobs and wishing I could find something worth dieing for so I wouldn't have to anymore, and I think making sure someone like you never wears a badge again fits the bill.

COP

(loud enough to be heard over the traffic)

You know, everything we do and say is being recorded, don't you?

JOB HUNTER

(loud enough to be heard over the traffic)

Oh, I was hoping so. Now both his family and mine will know exactly what was said and done by you. Unless, of course you made sure cameras were malfunctioning, then they'd <a href="https://discrep.com/have">have</a> to take your word for what happens here. The law says so, but I know our families. They wouldn't take your word for shit. They're decent, sober, quiet living, church going, folks whose lives will be shattered by what you intend to do today and my mother at least knows just how to make sure everybody knows it.

The cop pushes the button on his shoulder radio and nods toward it.

JOB HUNTER (CON'T)

Oh by all means, call for backup, just make sure you let them know, I'm not coming in til you leave. I don't trust you not to cause an accident otherwise. I like the idea (MORE)

CONTINUED: 81.

JOB HUNTER(CON'T) (cont'd) that when you've killed us both, you will have to tell this story a million times over and people <a href="mailto:still">still</a> won't believe you. You ready for your fifteen minutes of fame? Cause, I'm ready to make sure you get them!

COP

(Interrupts)

All right!! All right! I guess I can let you boys off with a warning. Just be more careful...and I better not catch you two again.

He takes the cuffs off Mark, walks back to his cruiser, gets in, and drives off. Neither Mark nor the Job Hunter move a muscle until the cruiser has disappeared from sight, then they get in the car and drive away.

INT. MARK'S SUV - A MINUTE LATER

MARK

I'm so screwed. He's gonna call the business and they're gonna fire me just because they can.

JOB HUNTER

They already rehired you once because they needed you to set up all the towns, remember?

MARK

Well, he's gonna do it anyway just to cause trouble...and they'll probably fire me again, then rehire me again, just to mess with me.

JOB HUNTER

That sounds like something they'd do. You think we should get off the street?

MARK

Yeah.

EXT. AN OFFRAMP ON THE INTERSTATE - SECONDS LATER.

The SUV pulls off the interstate and stops at a stoplight.

INT. MARK'S SUV - SECONDS LATER.

JOB HUNTER

I got an idea. Let's park the car behind the Holiday Inn, then take the bus back to my place, then you can get a cab or an Über from there back to work and drive back in your own car with someone else to retrieve the car. You can say you had car trouble.

MARK

That's actually a good idea. (smiles)
You been paying attention.

He fake hits the Job Hunter.

JOB HUNTER

(smiles.)

I had a good teacher.

EXT. THE BUS STOP OUTSIDE THE HOLIDAY INN - SOME TIME LATER The two men board the bus.

INT. THE BUS - CONTINUOUS

The Job Hunter scans his ticket twice for both of them and the two men sit down. The Job Hunter opens his briefcase and pulls out a bus schedule.

JOB HUNTER (CONT')

This bus turns onto Central and goes right by my place. We can get off there and you can call a cab or an Über to get you the rest of the way.

MARK

No need. If I'm reading that right, it goes all the way up Central to the Riverside Hospital. That's right past the office. I'll get somebody to ride back with me to get the truck.

CONTINUED: 83.

pause.

MARK (CON'T)

You know that cop would've shot you if you had been black, right?

JOB HUNTER

Hm. Probably would've tried to make me blow him if I'd been a woman, too.

MARK

Yeah. Thanks for saving my ass, homes.

JOB HUNTER

I just hope you didn't lose your job.

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO - LATER

The front door opens and The Job Hunter leaves his unfolded scooter by the door, tosses his mail on the chair in front of his computer, opens his briefcase, pulls out his folded clothes, and goes directly to-

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BATHROOM - SECONDS LATER.

He puts his shirt on a hanger and hangs his tie around it, then hangs his suit coat on his suit hanger, pulls off his dress shoes, then his suit pants which he hangs on the suit hanger with his suit coat. He then gathers all his good clothes and carries them in his underwear to-

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO BEDROOM - SECONDS LATER.

The Job Hunter hangs up his good clothes, pulls on yesterday's pants, and goes back out to-

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM - SECONDS LATER

The Job Hunter, picks up his mail, turns on his computer and flops down in front of it, looking exhausted.

CONTINUED: 84.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

I think I should take nap.

He looks at his phone.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

I wonder if I should call-

He visibly remembers something that angers him.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Aw  $\underline{\text{man}}$ ! I never got  $\underline{\text{her}}$  phone number.

He pounds harshly on the arm of the chair.

JOB HUNTER

Damn!

He opens his mail while the computer boots up. The first envelope is from the electric company. He examines it.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Looks like it's time for the folks to pay the bills again.

He opens the next envelope.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)

I'm up to \$6300 owed to the state now.

He notices the computer is up now and brings up YouTube.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Good god, I really did go viral.

He opens the video and let's it play in the background.

VIDEO

Will you people shut the fuck uuuuuuupp!!!

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)

Shit, there are people from Fox news, CNN, PBS, MSNBC, <u>everybody's</u> got something to say about this.

His face grows bitter.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)

Plenty to say, nothing to know.
Tens, maybe hundreds of millions of (MORE)

CONTINUED: 85.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T) (cont'd) us out here with no prospects and no future. No doubt they're gonna feed us all the answers with all their seven figure salaries and thousand dollar suits and-

The phone RINGS.

JOB HUNTER (V.O.)(CON'T)

That could be her!

He answers the phone.

JOB HUNTER

Hello?

INT. JOB HUNTER'S PARENTS' SECOND CONDO LIVING ROOM AND EMPLOYER'S OFFICE.

SPLIT SCREEN. The Job Hunter is on the right and the caucasian male EMPLOYER is on the left.

**EMPLOYER** 

Howdy. I'ma calling from Svenson Convenience Management. I found your resume on Job Serious. You still looking for work.

JOB HUNTER (Enthusiastically)

Yes!

**EMPLOYER** 

Good. Have you ever set up computers systems before?

JOB HUNTER

Several.

**EMPLOYER** 

Good. I'm looking to replace one of my guys. I'm gonna be honest here, he's Jewish and I didn't know that when I hired him. I swore I'd never have a Jew in this company. I don't trust 'em. I don't want 'em. I need him for now but it's time to hire his replacement. Now what I need-(actor free to ad lib)

The Job Hunter looks directly into the camera with a look that says 'What am I supposed to do now? I need a job but-'

CONTINUED: 86.
